QUEST OF HONOR

Grandmaster Thomas D. St. Charles is the first disciple (Pai Shinzan) to the late world renowned Grandmaster Daniel K. Pai, the first USA President of the Chinese Kuoshu Worldwide Promotion Association. Grandmaster St. Charles has been practicing and teaching martial arts for nearly 50 years. Achieving higher level ranks in Japanese and

Korean systems, he ultimately attained the first 7th Higher Level granted in Chinese Kung-fu by Grandmaster Pai, and is Grandmaster of the Shaolin White Dragon Kung-fu System. He has vast experience in practical and tournament applications of martial arts. He is an expert in personal security, with four experience for world-class performers. By 1974, he had amassed over 300 first place trophies in form and fighting, and, although fighting as a lightweight, was 20 times Tournament Grand Champion!

Master Jeffrey J. Guiffre was certified in China as a Teacher and the first American disciple (Dan Guang) of Great Master Wang Pei Sheng (Yin Cheng) of Beijing, continuing a direct teaching lineage of Great Masters from Yang Yu Ting, Wang Mao Zhai, and Quan You, the founder of the old and original Wu style Tai Ji Quan. Master Guiffre has been practicing and teaching Chinese meditative, healing, and martial arts since 1971.

Grandmaster Daniel K. Pai named him disciple "Bai Quan Li"; and tested and ranked him at the 5th Higher Level (Master) in the White Dragon System of Inwards Kung-fu. He is experienced as a contestant, judge, and organizer, and was awarded for "Distinguished Martial Arts," "Outstanding Judging," and "Outstanding Master's Performance" at National and International Chinese Kuoshu Federation Championships.
